Guidelines for HIPAA Business Associate Agreements

A Business Associate Agreement (BAA) is used when fully identifiable protected health information (PHI) is being shared with another party.

BAAs are meant for specific circumstances and if those circumstances are not met, a Data Use Agreement (DUA) should be used.

A Business Associate, as defined in the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act (HIPAA), is a person or entity who performs functions or activities on behalf of, or provides certain services to, a covered entity that involve access by the Business Associate to PHI. A covered entity may be a Business Associate of another covered entity if it performs such services for the other covered entity. A covered entity may disclose protected health information to an entity in its role as a Business Associate only to help the covered entity carry out its health care functions –
